From the Operations Manager's Desk

My first 7 months at Finley Regional Care have just flown by. Meeting all the wonderful residents and staff would have to be one of the biggest highlights. As this is my first venture into aged care, I continue to be amazed every day at the level of care, kindness and compassion shown to the residents that live here.

My main focus in the Operations Manager role is to ensure we have a talented, skilled workforce to provide the highest level of care to our residents. As we are working towards accreditation next year, I am currently reviewing all of our policies and procedures, contracts and position descriptions. Staff appraisals are also fully underway with most completed prior to 30 September 2017.

One of the projects I am currently working on is our Compliance System, WHS Online. Finley Regional Care will be introducing iPads over the next month to allow staff to quickly record Maintenance Requests, Hazard and Incident Reports. This will streamline processes and allow for quicker recording and monitoring of compliance issues.

Finley Regional Care has also been working closely with Finley Tafe this year to offer placement hours for students completing Certificate 3 and 4 in Aged Care and Community Services. Finley Tafe have provided fully funded training for 10 of our staff this year in Medication Management, Dementia and Palliative Care. We have also provided work experience for Finley High School Students and will continue to support the local community through offering school-based traineeships in 2018.

As this year slowly draws to a close, I can't help but be excited about 2018 with Alumuna and some other exciting new projects commencing. Xmas will be here before we know it, stay safe and enjoy the warmer weather.


